Video Playbook Program

The Coach's Office video playbook program is an add-on to the Coach's Office playbook. It is an effective method for reviewing game video clips with your playbook formations and plays in the slideshow.

Cut up the video outside Coach's Office with any digital video software system and insert the video clips to playbook pages by using the video playbook program. When finished, show the playbook – complete with video clips – in the Coach's Office slideshow presentation program.

Presentation Page Template & Presentation Folder

We recommend that you set up your playbook presentation with the presentation page template and consider adding a presentation folder.

Presentation Template

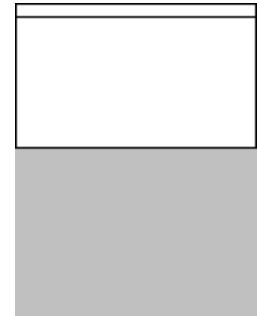
The “presentation” template displays the entire formation/play in the slideshow screen in a large window. It also makes it easy to click through the presentation, without scrolling around. The template has the title box and one large box at the top – the bottom is empty. The two boxes take up less than half the page and fit perfectly in the slideshow screen. (Template is shown at right.)

Non-Presentation Template

You may prefer to use other page templates for your presentations. You can scroll the page using the up/down scroll arrows on the right side of the slideshow toolbar to move around the page.

Slideshow Upgrade for Existing Playbook

The presentation template is included in new Coach's Office playbook program installs, beginning in mid 2013. If you are adding the slideshow program to an earlier Coach's Office license, your playbook file does not have the presentation template in the page template selections. But it is very quick and easy to create it in the pro playbook template builder. See our website tutorials page for the PDF “Playbook: Template Builder.”



Presentation Folder

Consider adding a folder at the bottom of the table of contents just for the presentation. For example, insert a chapter above or below the wristbands folder. You can quickly locate it in the slideshow menu, and it will be easy to exclude the pages when printing the playbook.

Video Format & Location

The supported video formats are DIVX, VOB, MPEG2, AMR, MOV, M4A, M4V, MP4, AVI, WMV.

The video files must first be made available to the video playbook program so they can be inserted into playbook pages. The files can be in a separate folder on the same computer, an external drive, or a network – any available location when you are ready to give the presentation.

The video clips are linked to the Coach's Office playbook page(s). When you give the playbook presentation, the playbook program will look for the video files in the same location they were in when you inserted them.

Create Presentation Pages in Playbook

It is easy: add a presentation chapter, add pages, put in the formations and plays, insert video.

- Insert a new chapter at the end of the table of contents. Enter the chapter name, such as *Presentation*.
- Insert a new page and choose the presentation template. Name the page.
- Define the boxes and add formations/plays as usual.

Insert Video

In the playbook, choose a playbook page and click the *Insert Video* icon in the toolbar. You will be guided to select the location and name of the video file to link to the page.

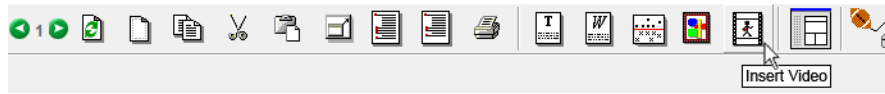

- Open the playbook.
- Select the page to receive the video link.
- Click *Insert Video* icon in the tool bar. (fig. 1)
- The Video Select window displays. (fig. 2)
 - The window lists the videos previously inserted into this page. (It is blank the first time.)
 - Manage the page's video list in this window – Get Video, Delete Video, Clear All.

Get Video

- Click *Get Video* to add video to the page.

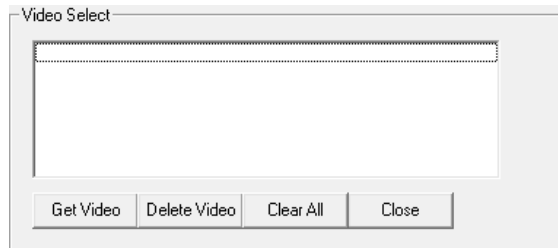

- Click the down arrow in the browse area and select the drive location of the video files. (fig. 3, top)
- Double click through the folder structure to the video file folder. (fig. 3, VideoClips highlighted)
 - The box below the folder structure lists the available video files in the folder.
- Click to select a video file, and the video name appears in the bottom box. (fig. 4, play0001.avi)

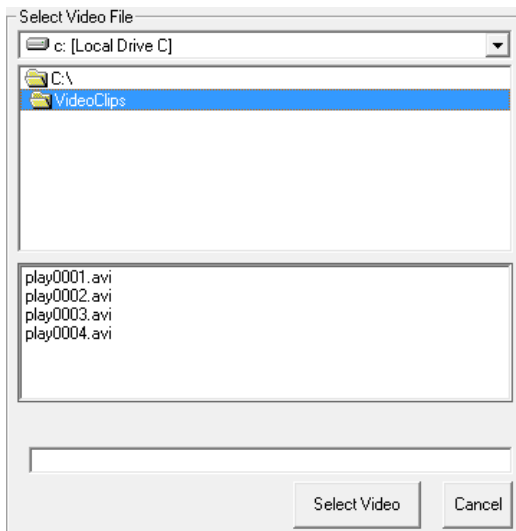

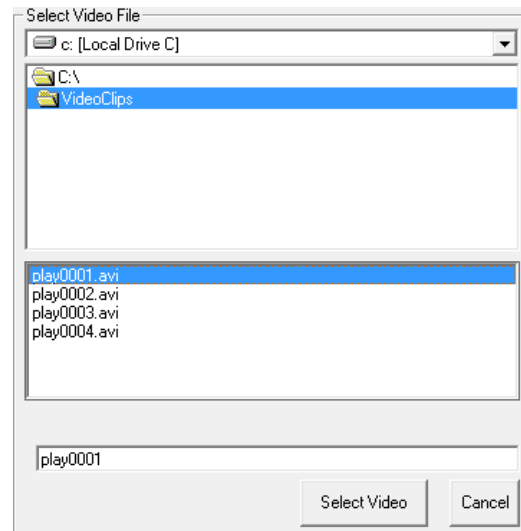

Select Video

- Click *Select Video* button.
- The video is saved in the Video Select window and linked to the playbook page. (fig. 5)
- Video is added to the list one file at a time. Continue adding video to the list for this page or click *Close* to return to the playbook.

Close

- When finished, click *Close* to return to the playbook.

Return to Playbook Program

Follow the same instructions to insert video into another playbook page or continue creating the playbook.

Slideshow

Show the playbook, with its linked video, in the slideshow.

- Attach or log onto the drive where the video clips are located.
- Open the slideshow from the Coach's Office menu screen.
- Select the chapter from the playbook table of contents. (fig. 6)
 - The chapter name displays in the top of the window. (fig. 7)
- Click *Continue*. The first page of the chapter displays in the slideshow window. (fig. 8)

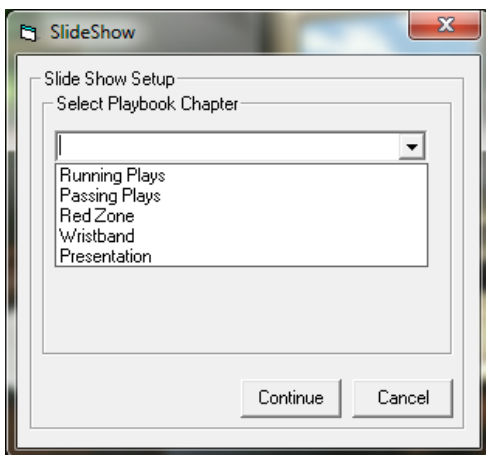

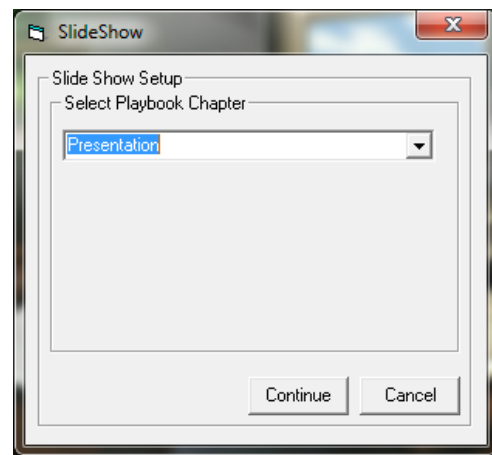
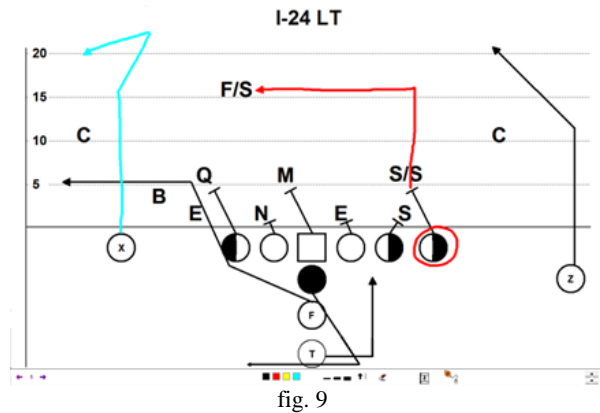
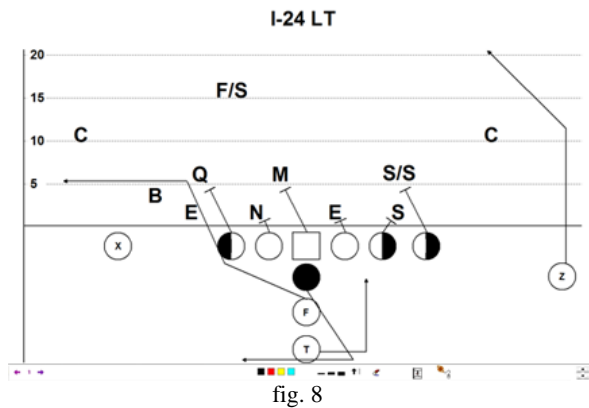

Slideshow Toolbar

At the left are page arrows to click through the pages of the selected playbook. The page numbers in the slideshow start at “1” for the chapter, even though the actual chapter page is something different. (fig. 10a)

The drawing tools are in the center. (fig. 10b)

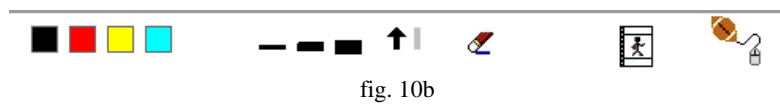
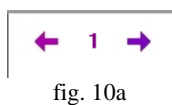
- Pen colors – black, red, yellow, blue
- Line width – 3 sizes
- Line end – with or without an arrow
- Erase all drawings

Next are the *Play Video* button and *Return to Coach’s Office* icon.

On the far right are the up/down scroll arrows to allow you to move up and down the page as needed. This is helpful when not using the presentation page template. (fig. 10c)

Draw on Slides

The slideshow drawing tools turn your mouse into a telestrator, allowing you to draw on top of the “slides”: playbook page or paused video. (The original page and video are not changed.) Choose the pen color, line width, and line end. Click and hold down the mouse and move to draw. (fig. 9, fig. 12)



Play Video

Click the *Play Video* button on a page that has linked video. The first video in the play list opens and plays in a video window on top of the slideshow page. The slideshow toolbar is still visible and accessible.

Video Toolbar

The buttons on the video toolbar are: slow motion back and forward, restart, fast back, pause/start, fast forward, display single screen, display quarter screen, close. (fig.11)



Single Screen Video

The default screen view is the single screen. (In figure 12, the single panel video is paused and drawn over.)

Quarter Screen Video

The benefit of showing the four-panel (quarter) screen view is that the stop-action frames display what happens in the next 10, 20, and 30 seconds in the play. (fig. 13)

Draw on Video Screen

Click *pause* and draw on top of the screen with the slideshow drawing tools. (fig. 10b, fig. 12)

Adding a one-click circle over a player is unique to the video screen. Simply click a player (or area) on a paused video screen. A yellow circle is added, with the mouse click as the center of the circle. (Yellow only.)

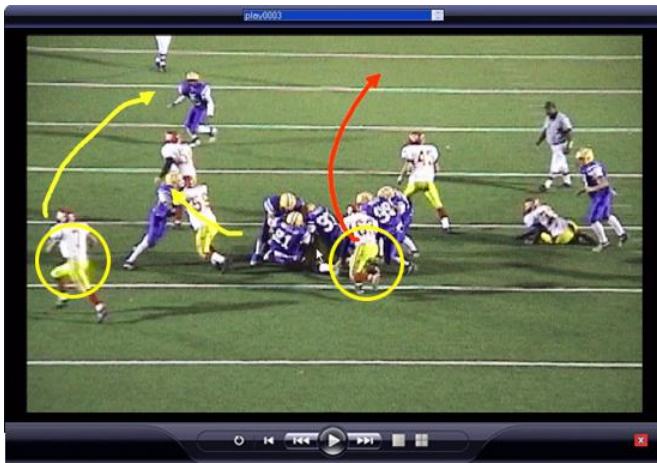

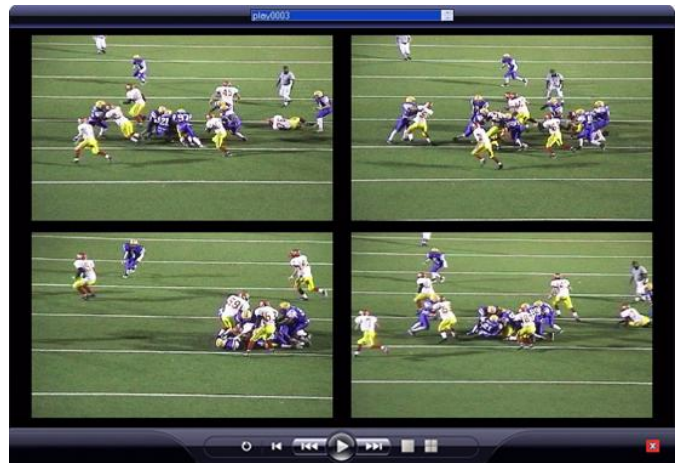

Video Play List

The video play list is at the top of the video screen with the name of the current video. (fig. 14)

- The first video in the list plays automatically when you click *Play Video*.
- If there are multiple videos for the page, play another video in the play list by clicking the up or down arrow and then clicking the name (turns to blue highlight). (fig. 15)
- Click the *Play* button in the video tool bar to play the video.

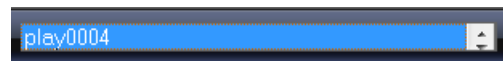

Video Not Found

If any of the video files for the selected playbook page are not found when it is chosen to play, a message will display in the top of the screen. (fig. 16) Click the message to continue, and, if there are multiple videos, the list displays. Choose the next video to play.

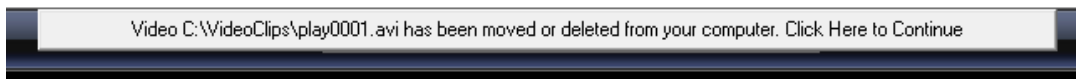

Locate missing files: Check the location of the linked video files. If the files are on an external drive, plug in the drive, and, if necessary, restart the slideshow to recognize the drive.
